September Show & Tell

We had some fantastic items brought in to share at September's Show & Tell meeting.

Cliff Thomas brought some of the wonderful pieces of Amethyst that had mined in Thunder Bay. He had several of them displayed in cool 'floating' cases that he had recently found.

Jordan Marche' had several nice pieces from their summer travels to the east. He had Fluorite from

Peytonville, PA and Calcite from Mt. Pleasant Mills, PA. Most of the fluorite from these locations occur in inclusions within the white calcite.

Brian & Cheri Zahn brought a number of really interesting items. The first was a shortwave light set-up that Brian had made for Cheri to use in New Jersey. They also had a piece of Fluorescent Tugtapite from New Jersey as well as some fluorescent Sodalite. They also brought a very neat Stone Tree to share, a beautiful purple Lagoona Agate and a Victoria Stone necklace that was gorgeous.

Michelle Bender had several pieces that she has collected this summer. She had some Honey Come Coral and a fantastic Chain Coral from the trip to Sturgeon Bay. She also had a very nice Calcite piece from a quarry in southwest Wisconsin.

Gwyn Padden-Lechten also had a number of great pieces from field trips this summer. She had Petosky Stones and Beach Stones with Copper from the Michigan trip; Emberlite from the Stugeon Bay Trip; Sphalerite and Galena from Shullsburg; Calcite Geode/Vug from a quarry in southwest Wisconsin and an Agate that her son found in Bellevue last year.

Andrew Jacobson has just started collected and his main interest (at least at the moment) is fluorescents. He had some Emberlite from Janesville and one from Eagle River as well as some fluorescent gems from local coin and thrift stores.

Mark Wolf brought a huge piece of fluorescent sodalite as well as several smaller pieces from the Rock County area. He also had a couple of agatized geodes from the Sihla Quarry.

Dan Trocke brought a nice piece of Lepidodendron Root that he found in 3 pieces in 2 different areas in Utica, IL. They fit perfectly together and have been reunited. He also brought a collection of the treasures found at Graves Mountain, Ga, including Rutile and Iridescent Hematite. The other items he brought included an Oridant Skull that he's been cleaning out of the matrix rock; a piece of lab grown Magnesium; and an amazing Vortex Marble from Raven Glass Works.

- Club "Genie", 6 wheel, 6" grinder / polisher
- A rented "Titan", 6 wheel, 8" grinder / polisher
- 14 lb capacity vibratory tumbler (Do you have some quartz hardness agate or other similar hardness stones to be tumbled? Bring them with).
- Geode cracker
- Club Flat lap or vibratory lap
- Club Facetor
- Kids are welcome to try the machines, but must be assisted by an adult.
- If you have a lapidary machine, tool, rock or project you would like to show or share please bring it.

Searching for Pyrite in Utica Illinois

Off we go. It's the crack of dawn on Saturday August 24th, 2019. We are on our way for a 3½ hour trip to Utica to join participants in the Badger Lapidary field trip. We found hundreds of specimens. Some quite small. Some medium sized and a few large ones.....we also found some petrified pieces of wood with pyrite nodules on them. Many of the rocks turn to dust in our hands. So we looked for the pyrite that maintains its form when handled. We found out from someone else after the trip that you need to bathe the pyrite in Iron Out (you know...the powdered stuff in a little water) in order to stop the process that pyrite goes through to break itself down. We purchased a bottle of the stuff and have been putting the ones we found in there to stabilize them a little more. As we review what we found, we did pretty well. And yes, I walked on a part of the pit floor that was muddy and sunk in up to my shins.... It was an anxiety moment until someone suggested I crawl out....I did....but I looked like I was coated with German Chocolate frosting. Actually lots of mud....We stopped at a rock shop on the way out of town just before six P.M. Thanks to Laurie and Dan Trocke for organizing a field trip such as this for the club. Even if pyrite isn't your thing....the people you meet are so interesting and the camaraderie can't be beat. I loved our trip to the pit. Come to the next field trip and experience the fun!
